ABOUT OUR COLLEGE

Presidency College, Motbung is the only Government College in Kangpokpi District of Manipur state, India. Pu Henkholen Sitlhou (01/07/1927-09/11/2013) is the founder of the College.

It was established on the 10th July 1973, with the specific aim of catering to the aspirations of the tribal community in the hilly areas of the then Senapati district, now Kangpokpi district of Manipur. It is one of the premier colleges in Manipur and received permanent affiliation from Manipur University, Canchipur, Imphal, Manipur since 1980. It is recognised by UGC under section 2(F) and 12(B) of the UGC Act 1956 vide letter No. MU/8/9/82-UGC(A)/3744 dated 12/11/1982. Having established with modest infrastructure and sheer determination, the college has grown from strength to strength and has become one of the best centres of learning in the state. The College is located at a hillside which is a part of the mighty Koubru Range, at a distance of about 26 km from the capital city Imphal towards the north along the National Highway No. 39, now known as Asian Highway No.1. The College straddles on a vast area of 21.59 acres (i.e. 87371.6 sq.m) of land with a constructed area of about 57135 Sq. m. (i.e. 65.4% of the total area). The area where the college lies is under 50-Saitu ST-Assembly Constituency.



Presidency College is a co-educational institution. Since its inception, the college has introduced both General and Honours for undergraduate Degree Courses in various subjects in Arts and Science streams. Further, Four Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUP) aligned with the National Education Policy (NEP 2020) has been introduced in the College from the 2022-23 academic session. Presidency College, Motbung is striving its best to commensurate with globalisation so as to meet the aspirations of the new generation.

FACILITIES AVAILABLE IN THE COLLEGE

1. NSS COMMITTEE

National Service Scheme (NSS) in Presidency College functions to foster social consciousness and community engagement among students through voluntary service. Various activities affecting the students and the community at large have been consistently undertaken by NSS.

2. COMPUTER LAB

To augment the ICT know-how of the students, computers are installed in the College to provide holistic computer education to the students.



3. LIBRARY

The college has a spacious library which keeps a number of rare books including religious books, cultural books, historical books, manuscripts, special books, academic books of different

subjects, etc. In due consideration with the development of library habits amongst the teaching faculty and students, the college has registered for E-Resources@N-List Programme under UGC Inflibnet, with Registration No. (College ID) 7136. Under this programme, all teaching and non-teaching staffs and the students are registered as free users. Members have access to a number of e-journals (more than 6293 titles) and e-books (more than 1.6 Lakhs titles) from this portal. These include national and international journals.





4. HOSTEL

Hostel facility is available for both boys and girl students studying in the College under the strict supervision, care and guidance of the Hostel Warden.



5. BIOTECH HUB

An Institutional level biotech hub has been established in the college under the sponsorship of the Department of Biotechnology, Governemnt of India. It is attached to the department of Botany of the college. The Biotech Hub serves as a center of research and experiments for various fields especially in biological sciences.

The Biotech Hub also undertakes various extension and awareness programmes in schools and colleges of Manipur.

The faculty of both streams of Arts and Sciences in Presidency College undertake different minor and major projects funded by U.G.C.
